Kathy Plumb contacted the RS ladies asking for things about their lives that everyone else might not know. Some of them were read to us by Shannon Bludworth to see if we could guess who she was talking about. This is the list that she read from:

I was bummed and embarrassed, but on the bright side, I spent the next day skipping all the lines in my wheelchair at Disneyland with two of the hottest boys on our trip. Not too bad of an experience after all. Sadly, I've never tried to surf again.
- 6. I was a Candy Striper (youth volunteer) at Primary Childrens' Hospital for three summers in a row during my high school years.

- 7. When I was about 5 or 6, my mom had to leave to work in the morning before I went to school. She would get me ready, and then leave. I would watch cartoons until it was time to leave and catch the school bus. One morning, I was watching cartoons when a bee flew over my head. I was so scared, I put a blanket over my head and sat there for an hour before I was brave enough to call my mom and tell her I missed the bus. Needless to say I missed school that day and enjoyed a full day of cartoons.
- 8. The first time I rappelled (climbing down rocks) I did a 100 ft free fall at the end.
- 9. I have a snake phobia; so big that I can't even see them on pictures or in movies. One day I was having a dream that a snake was about to bite me as I was walking on a trail. Right in that portion of my dream, I felt something on my face. I reacted quick, punching whatever it was; and woke up to a "Sweetie! It's me!" My poor husband was giving me a goodby kiss as he was leaving to work. We had just had a baby back then, and he advised me to be careful to not punch the baby, who was laying next to me.
- 10. I am very ticklish. When I got my first pedicure they started filing my feet and I tried so hard to control myself, but failed miserably. I ended up kicking the file out of the nail technician's hand and nearly kicking her in the face.
- 11. I was born in Salt Lake City and got married to a Marine when I was 18 and have since lived in San Diego, California, Belvedere, South Carolina, Murray and Sandy Utah. My husband went to Korea when we had just been married for two months, and was gone for a year. Some Honeymoon, HUH?
- 12. I walked down the red carpet after Catherine Zeta-Jones at one of her movie premiers.
- 13. I play the accordion.
- 14. I was featured in an article in the Church News, many, many years ago. I was attending a

When I went back to visit the school 15 years later, the Golden Garbage Can was still there.

- 23. I was obsessed with Hot Wheels cars when I was in the 4th grade. The floor of my bedroom was covered with the cars and their little orange tracks. \*\*\* I taught Aerobics Classes in the 80's. I could still fit into my old leg warmers. My old leotards, not so much. \*\*\* When I was 10, I learned the hard way that I should keep my dresser drawers closed. One night when I didn't, my cat crawled into my underwear drawer and gave birth to a litter of kittens.
- 24. In high school I was voted as having the "Prettiest feet and hands". Yup, that's me. PS: I should amend that it was in Girls' gym. Ha-ha!
- 25. I was in the High School Pep Club. We cheered and marched at all the football and basketball games.
- 26. I have a twin sister and we didn't look at all alike.
- 27. I have flown across the Pacific Ocean 20 times (Boy, are my arms tired!) I also really like the taste of escargot and caviar.
- 28. I grew up in the city, but my dad grew up on a farm in Idaho, so he brought a little bit of farm life to our family. We had chickens, a cow, a couple of horses, and a pig. When the chickens stopped laying eggs, Dad decided it time for them to be chicken dinner, so he would cut off their heads. The chickens would run around and chase us kids all around the backyard. Dad built a toboggan and we would put the cases of eggs in it and pull it to the Draper Poultry Plant. It was not easy, but we made of game of it, and had lots of fun doing it.

I didn't notice who was there because I was too self-conscious of the large birthmark on my right leg. Fortunately, we never had a reason to go back to that pool again.

I had to tell my date that I couldn't go to the dance because of what I done on my previous date that day. Neither one of the guys ever asked me out again.
