The recipes from the last
Homemaking meeting are:

Citrus Salad

4 med. grapefruit, peeled with
white membrane removed
4 oranges, peeled, or drained
mandarin oranges
2 Kiwi, sliced
1 Star fruit, sliced
2 bags of mixed lettuce

Dressing:

1/3 c. sugar
1/4 tsp. white pepper
1 clove garlic, minced
1/4 c. raspberry vinegar
2 T. vegetable oil
Drizzle dressing over salad.
Serves 15

Ham Rolls

24 1/8" slices of ham

Filling:

1 pkg. chopped frozen broccoli
(cooked and drained)
1/2 c. chopped green pepper
1/2 tsp. dry mustard
1 beaten egg
1/2 pt. sour cream
salt to taste

Mix together. Place 1 Tb.
filling on each slice of ham.
Roll into quarter-sized rolls and
hold with toothpick.
Bake 325° for 30 min. uncovered.
Drain ham rolls after cooking.

Sauce:

1/2 pt. sour cream
2 cans cream of mushroom soup
Heat and pour over ham rolls.
