PERSONAL AND FAMILY PREPAREDNESS

Where will you and your family be when disaster strikes? Disaster can strike quickly and without warning. It can force you to evacuate or confine you to your home. You can cope by being prepared and knowing what to do. Here is a Family Disaster Checklist that might help you be better prepared.1. Find out about the types of disasters that can occur in your area and what to do in each case. (I will be giving you information on this in the next few newsletters, so you may want to clip the info out and keep it handy.) 2. Determine two escape routes from each room in your home. 3. Pick two places to meet: *One right outside your home in case of sudden emergency, like fire. *One outside your neighborhood in case you can't return home. Everyone should know the address & phone number. 4. Ask an out-of-state friend to be your family contact. After a disaster it is easier to call long distance. 5. Create a Disaster supply kit (72 hour kit) 6. discuss what to do in an evacuation 7. Teach your children how and when to call 911 and other emergency numbers. Post the numbers near all your phones. 8. Show each responsible family member how and when to turn off utilities at the main switches. Turn off utilities ONLY if you suspect damage or if you are told to do so.9. Show family members how to use a fire extinguisher (ABC-type) and where it is kept. 10. Make sure your insurance coverage is adequate.
