BISHOPRIC MESSAGE

Bishopric Message – August 2009 Tithing, Fasting, Fast Offerings 3 Nephi 24:10

Depending on how money is used, it can represent very different things. For example, it can represent material possessions, power, greed, or the simple necessities of life. If money is used in a certain way, even in small amounts, it can represent our desire to help build the kingdom of God. It can represent our concern for others. And it can represent our faith, obedience, and love for the Lord.

We should pay tithing because we love the Lord and have faith in Him, not just because we need blessings. Elder Joseph B. Wirthlin of the Quorum of the Twelve said that "the payment of tithing has less to do with money, but more to do with faith"

Many welfare challenges could be prevented by proper adherence to the law of the fast. President Spencer W. Kimball taught that "upon practicing the law of the fast, one finds a personal well-spring of power to overcome self-indulgence and selfishness"

Giving a generous fast offering blesses both the giver and the receiver. "Think . . . of what would happen if the principles of fast day and the fast offering were observed throughout the world. The hungry would be fed, the naked clothed, the homeless sheltered. . . . The giver would not suffer but would be blessed by his small abstinence. A new measure of concern and unselfishness would grow in the hearts of people everywhere" (Gordon B. Hinckley).

"The longer I live, the more impressed I am with the Lord's system of caring for the poor and needy. Surely no man would think of such a simple yet profound way of satisfying human needs—to grow spiritually and temporally through periodic fasting and then donating the amount saved from refraining from partaking of those meals to the bishop to be used to administer to the needs of the poor, the ill, the downtrodden, who need help and support to make their way through life."(L. Tom Perry).

"Let me promise you here today that if the Latter-day Saints will honestly and conscientiously from this day forth, as a people, keep the monthly fast . . . and if in addition to that they will pay their honest tithing, it will solve all of the problems in connection with taking care of the Latter-day Saints . . . "Every living soul among the Latter-day Saints that fasts two meals once a month will be benefited spiritually and be built up in the faith of the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ—benefited spiritually in a wonderful way—and sufficient means will be in the hands of the bishops to take care of all the poor" (Heber J. Grant).
