#### RESURRECTION/ATONEMENT

Like all of you, I mourn the passing of Sister Haight.. There are so many wonderful things we can say about Audrey. Her funeral service was beautiful. It was beautiful for many reasons. But one was because the Spirit of God was present. This strong feeling of peace and hope would be something that Audrey would have wanted. The two hymns we sang are two of my favorite. "How Great Thou Art " and "The Spirit of God like a Fire is Burning."

"The Spirit of God like a Fire is Burning" was written by W.W.Phelps. The hymn was sung for the dedication of the Kirtland Temple in 1836. I don't know why Sister Haight and her family chose this hymn but I am glad she did. The words felt like a celebration of Audrey's life and testimony Combining the tune with the words of the1st verse is the perfect way to "sing" my testimony of the restored gospel.

The Spirit of God like a fire is burning; The latter day glory begins to come forth;

The visions and blessings of old are returning; The angels are coming to visit the earth.

The last two lines of the following stanza would reflect our feelings about Audrey and all of our beloved ward members who have left us.

We call in our solemn assemblies, in spirit, to spread forth the kingdom of heaven abroad,

That we through our faith may begin to inherit The visions, and blessings, and glories of God.

In his remarks at the end of the funeral, Bishop Lloyd spoke of the Savior and the certainty of our resurrection and the hope of eternal life with our family; I felt gratitude for Christ. I felt a renewed desire to keep my covenants and to make the Savior Jesus Christ the focal point of my life. I have heard our Bishop tell the youth in our ward, more than once, to make Christ the center of their lives.

Yea come unto Christ, and love God with all your might, mind and strength, then is his grace sufficient for you... (Moroni 10:32)

This scripture mentions something we can all do. Through the grace and mercy of the Lord Jesus Christ: if we can deny ourselves of <u>ungodliness</u>, and <u>love God</u>, his grace will be sufficient.

On the Sabbath following Sister Haight's funeral we sang again "The Spirit of God" to celebrate a new Temple. The Temple: where we perform the most sacred ordinances to prepare ourselves and our families for the highest degree of glory in God's Celestial Kingdom. Two great spiritual experiences. Sister Haight's funeral, which brings sadness but also reminds us of the hope that the atonement brings and the faith that Audrey had in Christ's atonement.

And then as if to verify this hope and faith...we sing this hymn again to celebrate the dedication of a Holy Temple. It was in a similar dedicated Temple that Brother and Sister Haight exercised their faith in Christ's infinite work by having their marriage sealed through priesthood authority. Thus giving hope to their posterity of eternal life.

We all have this opportunity to exercise our faith in the infinite atonement of God's Only Begotten. Indeed The Spirit of God like a fire is burning.
