# WILLOW CANYON 1ST WARD APRIL 2010 \*\*\*\*\*\* DISCIPLESHIP

On Palm Sunday nearly 2,000 years ago, The Savior Jesus Christ entered the city of Jerusalem during the final week of His mortal life. He rode a donkey, and as He rode, a great multitude came out to greet Him and laid palm leaves, flowering branches, and even their own garments in His path. They cried, "Blessed be the King that cometh in the name of the Lord" and "Hosanna to the Son of David." Of this event President Uchtdorf said, "Perhaps the disciples thought this was a turning point the moment when the Jewish world would finally recognize Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah. But the Savior understood that many of the shouts of praise and acclamation would be temporary. He knew that soon He would ascend to the Mount of Olives and there, alone in Gethsemane, take upon Himself the sins of the world." A good test of discipleship perhaps isn't when the Savior arrives triumphant. But perhaps when we find ourselves alone as He was in the garden of Gethsemane. There seems to be many variations and explanations of discipleship. Elder Uchtdorf said, :the gospel is the way of discipleship" Sometimes it is easier to live as a disciple when we know we are being watched. The Son of God went into the garden and He alone took upon himself the sins of the world. He was alone in every sense of the word. It was necessary for the Father to leave his only Begotten during the greatest moment in history. He was alone in a way we will never know. Elder Joseph B. Wirthlin said, "Oh, it is wonderful to know that our Heavenly Father loves us, even with all our flaws! His love is such that even should we give up on ourselves, He never will. We might see ourselves in terms of yesterday and today. Our Heavenly Father sees us in terms of forever...."Knowing God will never abandon us should give us more faith to live as a disciple when we are physically alone and also when we feel we are suffering alone. Of course, we never are without the Savior's love and concern and help. The blessings of discipleship requires patience. President Uchtdorf says, "a friend of mine recently wrote to me, confiding that he was having a difficult time keeping his testimony strong and vibrant. He asked for counsel. I wrote back to him and lovingly suggested a few specific things he could do that would align his life more closely with the teachings of the restored gospel. To my surprise, I heard back from him only a week later. The essence of his letter was this; "I tried what you suggested. It didn't work. What else have you got?" The gospel is like a seed. We don't plant one day and expect a crop of corn the next.

It's obvious to me our ward is full of disciples. Many have lived long lives filled with the patience of a true disciple. A brief visit with these members will leave a permanent impression with you of their spirituality and discipleship. Yet, they probably aren't wealthy with money, they are not perfectly healthy, their children are not all perfect and their lives are not free of trial. But they are disciples! They will be blessed and have been blessed. I believe the words of Elder Uchtdorf (April General Conference 2009) "Let us remember on this Palm Sunday, during this Easter season, and always that the restored gospel of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ has the power to fill any emptiness, heal any wound, and bridge any vale of sorrow. It is the way of hope, faith and trust in the Lord. I bear my solemn witness that Jesus Christ lives. He is the Savior and Redeemer of the world. He is the promised Messiah. He lived a perfect life and atoned for our sins. He will ever be at our side. He will fight out battles. He is our hope; He is our salvation; He is the way. Of this I testify in the sacred name of Jesus Christ, amen."
