OCTOBER 2013 THEME - BECOMING MORE CHRISTLIKE

Consider these questions from Preach My Gospel:

How can I develop attributes that will make me a more powerful and effective minister of the gospel of <u>Jesus Christ</u>?

How will developing Christlike attributes help me fulfill my purpose as a missionary? Which attribute do I most need to develop?

At the beginning of His mortal ministry, Jesus Christ walked along the shore of the sea of Galilee and called out to two fishermen, Peter and Andrew. "Follow me," He said, "and I will make you fishers of men" (Matthew 4:19; see also Mark 1:17). The Lord has also called you to His work, and He invites you to follow Him. The invitation to follow Christ is an invitation to follow His example and to become like Him.

Ok, so becoming like Christ sounds a bit daunting. Following is a list of Christ-like attributes that we can work on to becoming more like the Savior: Faith, Hope, Charity, Love, Virtue, Knowledge, Humility and Diligence. However we are going to focus on Patience. This is a good one to focus on for me.

Patience is the capacity to endure delay, trouble, opposition, or suffering without becoming angry, frustrated, or anxious. It is the ability to do God's will and accept His timing. When you are patient, you hold up under pressure and are able to face adversity calmly and hopefully. Patience is related to hope and faith—you must wait for the Lord's promised blessings to be fulfilled.

You need patience in your everyday experiences and relationships. You must be patient with all people, yourself included, as you work to overcome faults and weaknesses. There are a few things that stand out to me: "capacity to endure delays" with becoming frustrated. Accept "His timing".

The sons of Mosiah have a story of patience that starts in Mosiah 28:

- 1...^asons of Mosiah ... took a small number with them and returned to their father, the king, and desired of him that he would grant unto them that they might, with these whom they had ^bselected, go up to the land of ^cNephi that they might preach the things which they had heard, and that they might impart the word of God to their brethren, the Lamanites—

 2 ^aThat perhaps they might bring them to the knowledge of the Lord their God, and convince them of the iniquity of their fathers; and that perhaps they might cure them of their ^bhatred towards the Nephites, that they might also be brought to rejoice in the Lord their God, that they might become friendly to one another, and that there should be no more contentions in all the land which the Lord their God had given them.
- 3 Now they were desirous that salvation should be declared to every creature, for they could not abear that any human bsoul should perish; yea, even the very thoughts that any soul should endure dendless torment did cause them to quake and tremble.
- 4 And thus did the Spirit of the Lord work upon them, for they were the very avilest of sinners. And the Lord saw fit in his infinite mercy to spare them; nevertheless they suffered much anguish of soul because of their iniquities, suffering much and fearing that they should be cast off forever. - 5 And it came to pass that they did plead with their father many days that they might go up to the land of Nephi.
- 6 And king Mosiah went and <u>inquired</u> of the Lord if he should let his sons go up among the Lamanites to preach the word.
- 7 And the Lord said unto Mosiah: Let them go up, for many shall believe on their words, and they shall have eternal life; and I will adeliver thy sons out of the hands of the Lamanites.

And in Alma 17 we read about these sons"

- 10 And it came to pass that the Lord did <u>visit</u> them with his <u>Spirit</u>, and said unto them: Be <u>comforted</u>. And they were comforted.
- 11 And the Lord said unto them also: Go forth among the Lamanites, thy brethren, and establish my word; yet ye shall be "patient in long-suffering and afflictions, that ye may show forth good "examples unto them in me, and I will make an instrument of thee in my hands unto the salvation of many souls.
- "Life is full of difficulties, some minor and others of a more serious nature. There seems to be an unending supply of challenges for one and all. Our problem is that we often expect instantaneous solutions to such challenges, forgetting that frequently the heavenly virtue of patience is required."


CUB SCOUTS
