#### August 2017 - Repentance

In his letter to John Wentworth, the Prophet Joseph Smith penned for the first time the fundamental and characteristic doctrines of the Gospel as taught by the Church. Published in the March 1st, 1842 edition of the "Times and Seasons," these doctrines have become known as the Articles of Faith of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. In the 4th Article of Faith, the Prophet decreed that "... the first principles . . . of the Gospel are: first, Faith in the Lord Jesus Christ; second, Repentance; . . ."

Faith in the Lord Jesus Christ is fundamental to the Gospel. The Prophet Joseph Smith taught that faith is a principle of power that motivates our day-to-day activities. It is faith that gives each of us confidence to act. And when acted upon, faith grows; line upon line, precept upon precept. Our faith needs to continue to grow until it is sufficient unto salvation.

Faith in Jesus Christ naturally leads to repentance. We came to earth to grow and progress. However, except for Christ, everyone who has lived upon the earth has sinned. Therefore, we all have a need to repent. In First John, we read, "If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us." (1 John 1:8). Sometimes we sin because of our weaknesses, and sometimes because of willful disobedience. "Repentance is a result of contrition of soul, which springs from a deep sense of humility and this in turn is dependent upon the exercise of an abiding faith in God. Repentance, therefore properly ranks as the second principle of the Gospel, closely associated with and immediately following faith." (Articles of Faith, Talmage, page 109)

Repentance is the way provided for us to become free from our sins and receive forgiveness for them. Sin slows our spiritual progression and can even stop it. Repentance makes it possible for us to grow and develop spiritually again. Repentance is made possible through the atonement of Jesus Christ.

The first step of repentance is to admit to ourselves that we have sinned. If we do not admit this, we cannot repent. "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:9) In addition to recognizing our sins, we must feel sincere sorrow for what we have done wrong, forsake our sins, confess them to the Lord (and for those that might

affect our standing in the Church, to the proper priesthood authority), and, as much as possible, make right any wrong we have done.

In addition, if we hope to obtain forgiveness, we must forgive those who may have sinned against us. Repentance is not complete if our hearts are not fully cleansed of all hatred, bitterness, and bad feelings against other people. "Wherefore, I say unto you, that ye ought to forgive one another; for he that forgiveth not his brother of his trespasses standeth condemned before the Lord; for there remaineth in him the greater sin." (D&C 64:9)

Finally, a crucial step in the repentance process is to show confidence in Christ's atoning sacrifice. This means that we must do our best to keep the commandments of God. "For I the Lord cannot look upon sin with the least degree of allowance; Nevertheless, he that repents and does the commandments of the Lord shall be forgiven." (D&C 1: 31-32) We are not fully repentant if we do not pay tithes or keep the Sabbath day holy or obey the Word of Wisdom. If we do not pray and are unkind to others, we are surely not repentant. When we have truly repented, our life changes.

Repentance is essential to our salvation. God has promised forgiveness unto those who truly repent. It is unto such that the advantages of individual salvation, through the atonement of Christ, are extended. "Seek ye the Lord while he may be found, call ye upon him while he is near: Let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts: and let him return unto the Lord, and he will have mercy upon him; and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon." (Isaiah 55: 6-7).
