February 2017 - Peace in this World

In the scriptures, "peace" is often spoken of from two perspectives. First there is "peace"; the absence of wars, contentions, and strife. This was a condition the Nephites were only able to experience from time to time, for short periods of time, from the time they left Jerusalem through the first part of 3rd Nephi. The longest period of this "peace" in the Book of Mormon came following the Savior's visit. In 4th Nephi, we read: "And it came to pass that there was no contention in the land, because of the love of God which did dwell in the hearts of the people. And there were no envyings, nor strifes, nor tumults, nor whoredoms, nor lyings, nor murders, nor any manner of lasciviousness; and surely there could not be a happier people among all the people who had been created by the hand of God. There were no robbers, nor murderers, neither were there Lamanites, nor any manner of -ites; but they were in one, the children of Christ, and heirs to the kingdom of God." (4 Nephi 1:15-17)

For the space of two-hundred years, the descendants of Lehi lived in "peace." However the scriptures tell us this "peace" was never intended to be permanent; at least not until that millennial day when Christ shall return again.

The second perspective of "peace" a more personal peace; an inner peace, a spiritual peace. In the Epistle of Paul the Apostle to the Philippians, he wrote: "Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:6-7) This is the peace the prophet Abinadi possessed, that allowed him to stand boldly before the wicked King Noah and his priests and declare unto them with confidence the errors of their ways. This peace is a gift of God to the obedient. "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid." (John 14:27) "These things I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world." (John 16:33)


Following their miraculous visitation from an Angel, and their conversion, Alma the younger and the sons of Mosiah were blessed with this spiritual peace. In the 27th chapter of Mosiah, it is recorded: "And now it came to pass that Alma began from this time forward to teach the people, and those who were with Alma at the time the angel appeared unto them, traveling round about through all the land, publishing to all the people the things which they had heard and seen, and preaching the word of God in much tribulation, being greatly persecuted by those who were unbelievers, being smitten by many of them. . . . And they traveled throughout all the land of Zarahemla, and among all the people who were under the reign of king Mosiah, zealously striving to repair all the injuries which they had done to the church, confessing all their sins, and publishing all the things which they had seen, and explaining the prophecies and the scriptures to all who desired to hear them. And thus they were instruments in the hands of God in bringing many to the knowledge of the truth, yea, to the knowledge of their Redeemer. And how blessed are they! For they did publish peace; they did publish good tidings of good; and they did declare unto the people that the Lord reigneth." (Mosiah 27:32, 35-37)

Those who gain this "peace" in this life shall die in peace, continue in peace in the paradise of God, and then rise in the resurrection to inherit eternal peace in the kingdom of God. "But learn that he who doeth the works of righteousness shall receive his reward, even peace in this world, and eternal life in the world to come." (D&C 59:23) For, as Abinadi taught; "And again, how beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of those that are still publishing peace! And again, how beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of those who shall hereafter publish peace, yea, from this time henceforth and forever! And behold, I say unto you, this is not all. For O how beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him that bringeth good tidings, that is the founder of peace, yea, even the Lord, who has redeemed his people; yea, him who has granted salvation unto his people." (Mosiah 15:16-18)




