July 2018 – The Life of Christ

This month we focus on the life of Jesus Christ. From *The Living Christ: A Testimony of the Apostles*, “We solemnly testify that His life, which is central to all human history, neither began in Bethlehem nor concluded on Calvary. He was the Firstborn of the Father, the Only Begotten Son in the flesh, the Redeemer of the world. He rose from the grave to ‘become the firstfruits of them that slept.’”

They further testify: “None other has had so profound an influence upon all who have lived and will yet live upon the earth. He was the Great Jehovah of the Old Testament, the Messiah of the New. Under the direction of His Father, He was the creator of the earth. “All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made.” (John 1:3) Though sinless, He was baptized to fulfill all righteousness. He “went about doing good” (Acts 10:38), yet was despised for it. His gospel was a message of peace and goodwill. He entreated all to follow His example. He walked the roads of Palestine, healing the sick, causing the blind to see, and raising the dead. He taught the truths of eternity, the reality of our premortal existence, the purpose of our life on earth, and the potential for the sons and daughters of God in the life to come.”

We learn of the Savior so we can emulate His actions, behavior, and motivations. We are invited to “come, follow Him.” Indeed, He invites us to “walk with me.” This is impossible if we only seek to learn about Him. We must seek to know Him. In the April 2017 conference, Elder Eyring taught the priesthood holders, “I testify that we come to know Him best by working with Him and serving Him in the great work of bringing salvation to God’s children. ‘For how knoweth a man the master whom he has not served, and who is a stranger unto him, and is far from the thoughts and intents of his heart?’ ” Explaining further, Elder Eyring said, “And what does it mean to walk with the Lord? It means to do what He does, to serve the way He serves. He sacrificed His own comforts to bless those in need, so that’s what we try to do. He seemed to take particular notice of people who were overlooked and even shunned by society, so we should try to do that too. He testified boldly yet lovingly of the true doctrine

He received from His Father, even if it was unpopular, and so must we. He said to all, 'Come unto me' (Matthew 11:28), and we say to all, 'Come unto Him.' "

As we learn of the Savior's life, let us inspect our own weaknesses and remove the beam in our own eye rather than focus on the mote in another. As we try to be like Him, let us minister to those around us regardless of assignment or familiarity. Let us look to offer a kind and uplifting word, to sacrifice our own comforts to bless those in need, to take notice and help the shunned.

Let us lovingly testify of Him and invite all to come unto Him.

Elder Eyring promised, "As soon as we accept the Lord's invitation 'Walk with me,' the nature of our ... service changes. It becomes all at once higher and nobler but also more achievable, because we know that we are not alone."

The Savior's example is perfect. His doctrine is perfect. As we study His life and teachings we can then emulate His example by serving and loving the way He served and loved. We will then become more like Him and will know Him, not simply know about His life.

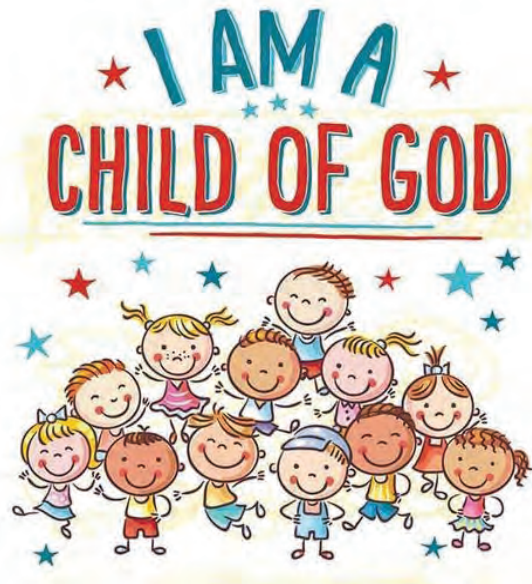
