January 2019 – Ministering and Missionary Work

In 1975, Elder W. Grant Bangerter said the following in a Conference address:

Five years ago if you had asked, "Who's the 'minister' of your Church?" most of us would have answered, "Oh, the bishop." Today we can't give that simple answer because we know that many of the duties have now been shifted over to the elders, where the revelations say they rightfully belong. Now a ward should have at least fifty "ministers" in place of the one we thought of a few years ago.

Now think of the increased power to carry the gospel forward when fifty men do their duty as the bishop has done it in the past.

Add to that 55 ministering sister companionships and imagine the great work that can occur in our ward alone!

Elder Bangerter proceeds to talk about the very real aspect of ministering to the sick through the power and authority of the priesthood, and then says this:

But why limit your testimony to that? Why not as readily send the elders to administer help to a father whose son is about to die spiritually on drugs or alcohol? Why not call on the priesthood to bless a home that is about to die through divorce or transgression? Why not administer through the priesthood to those who love the world more than God?

Why do we blithely say, "We did our home teaching" when half of the families in the Church are in a condition to be "wasted" when the Savior comes because they have not been "sealed up" to eternal life? There is a ministry here for the elders far more extensive than that of laying hands on the sick. A person healed of bodily sickness will eventually become sick again and die. When you administer the gospel, the cure can be permanent.

Brothers and sisters, ministering is not reduced home teaching, it is the higher law of home and visiting teaching. President Nelson called it, "A newer, holier approach to caring and ministering to others." and Elder Eyring said the Lord has called for "greater, more focused caring." Elder Holland said that "We should mature personally...rising above any mechanical function-withoutfeeling routine to the heartfelt discipleship articulated by the Savior at the conclusion of His earthly ministry, 'Love one another as I have loved you.'"

Furthermore, Elder Holland suggests that beyond the schedule of regular visits, ministering can be supplemented with telephone calls, written notes, texts, emails, video chats, conversations at church meetings, shared service projects, social activities, and a host of possibilities in the world of social media.

Elder Holland issues this warning, "I warn you, a new name, new flexibility, fewer reports will not make one ounce of difference in our service unless we see this as an invitation to care for one another in a bold, new, holier way."

I invite each of you that are fourteen or older to recommit to ministering. For inspiration, spend some time at <u>https://www.lds.org/ministering</u>. There are many in our ward who could use support, yet don't know who their ministering brothers and sisters are. As we refocus to a home-centered, churchsupported gospel, let us provide that support in the homes of our friends and neighbors by visiting regularly and sharing the gospel.
