The more we allow the love of God to govern our minds and emotions – the more we allow our love for our Heavenly Father to swell within our hearts – the easier it is to love others with the pure love of Christ. As we open our hearts to the glowing dawn of the love of God, the darkness and cold of animosity and envy will eventually fade.”

In Ephesians 4:32 we read, “And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ’s sake hath forgiven you.”

None of us are perfect. May each of us strive to be better at loving one another, forgiving one another, and correcting those words or actions that may have caused hurt to others.

Let us follow the example and faith of Enos, “My faith began to be unshaken in the Lord; and I prayed unto him with many long strugglings for my brethren, the Lamanites. And it came to pass that after I had prayed and labored with all diligence, the Lord said unto me: I will grant unto thee according to thy desires, because of thy faith.” (Enos 1:11-12)  
Pray with faith and know that Christ can and will change you.  
Love as the Savior does and let Him into our hearts.

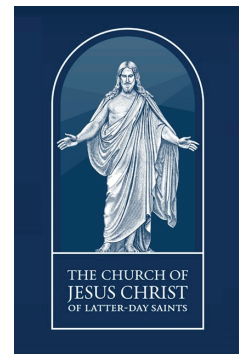
## Spiritual Thought

There have been and will be times in your daily life, when you may find yourself in a situation where the spirit will prompt you to share your testimony. President Brigham Young recalled his experience when he first received a witness of the truthfulness of the gospel from a man’s simple testimony. From this experience he said, “If all the talent, tact, wisdom, and refinement of the world had been combined in one individual, and that person had been sent to me with the Book of Mormon, and had declared in the most exalted of earthly eloquence, the truth of it, undertaking to prove it by his learning and worldly wisdom, it would have been to me like the smoke which arises only to vanish. But when I saw a man without eloquence, or talents for public speaking, who could only just say, ‘I know by the power of the Holy Ghost that the Book of Mormon is true, that Joseph Smith is a prophet of the Lord,’ [the] Holy Ghost proceeding from that individual illuminate[d] my understanding, and light, glory, and immortality [were] before me.”
