Our spirited and loving mother, grand mother, great-grandmother, sister, aunt, and friend, Pauline "Dody" Hendricks, age 85, passed on to the next life at her home in Sandy, Utah, and was reunited with her dear husband on January 31, 2023. She was always up to date on the latest news and stayed well-informed about issues relating to politics and government.
