

Three in Family Die As Semi and Vehicle Collide

SPANISH FORK — Three members of a Utah family were killed Thursday night when their vehicle and a semi collided about six miles up Spanish Fork Canyon on U.S. 6, according to the Utah Highway Patrol.

Although details were still under investigation Friday, UHP Trooper James Brierley said the semi apparently veered "left of center" on the highway, forcing Michael McCloy to swerve in an attempt to avoid it.

The two vehicles collided at an angle. The road was dry at the time, said the trooper.

Killed were twin brothers James McCloy, 44, Salem, and Jon McCloy, 44, Sandy.

Also killed was Spencer McCloy, 8, son of Jon McCloy, said Trooper Brierley.

The driver of their Jeep Wagoneer was a third McCloy brother, Michael, 34, Murray, who suffered back injuries and a scalp laceration. He was transferred from Mountain View Hospital in Payson to Cottonwood Hospital in Murray, where he was in serious but stable condition Friday.

The McCloy vehicle was eastbound in the canyon at 8:40 p.m. when it faced the westbound semi driven by Thomas Green, 31, Zwolle, La., said Trooper Brierley.

Mr. Green suffered lacerations and was in fair condition Friday at Mountain View Hospital.
