One of Father in Heaven's choicest spirits, Francyne Poulter North, 75, returned to His presence on the evening of January 17, 2022. Under the skilled care of very caring, compassionate, and expert physicians and

other medical staff, Francyne fought against and won her battle with chronic lymphocytic leukemia (CLL): she will never again be afflicted by the physical ailments associated with living.

Francyne was born in Phoenix, Arizona on March 19, 1946 to Myrtle Clawson and Howard William Poulter. From an early age, Francyne adored and learned many things from her grandmother, Hannah Allen Clawson, and was lovingly teased by her friend and brother, "My Brian" Howard Poulter. She was proud of her graduation from Phoenix Union High School. Francyne moved to Utah and worked for Mountain Bell for nearly ten years as a telephone operator before accepting her true life's calling and meaning in being a wife, mother, aunt, friend, and grandmother.

On August 17th, 1972, Francyne married and was sealed to LaVar Sylvester North in the Salt Lake City, Utah Temple for time and all eternity. Francyne and LaVar had three sons together – Jordan Allen, Mark Andrew, and Kelly Ryan – and often spent time camping and enjoying the outdoors. Francyne's greatest joy and accomplishments in her life related to raising her three sons, being a mother and grandmother, and she often told everyone how much she loved and cherished each one of them.

She was a lifelong and faithful member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. She had an unflinching testimony of Heavenly Father, Jesus Christ, the Gospel plan, living prophets and apostles, and loved to discuss every aspect of the Restoration. Putting the gospel into action is what she did best as she supervised ministering activities and organized blood and cancer drives that would help people struggling with physical challenges. She encouraged everybody to follow the example of her Savior Jesus Christ.

Francyne had a special love for cats and enjoyed drawing and sketching cartoon characters. She loved everything Peanuts – especially Snoopy and Woodstock – because her brother Brian also loved them. She aimed to connect with others through interest in and support of others' hobbies regardless of what they were. She loved the freedoms and other principles inspired by the United States Constitution by her various displays of patriotism.

Francyne was preceded in death by her husband, LaVar (1991), mother, Myrtle (2009), brother Brian (2017), and father, William (2001). Francyne is survived by her three sons, Jordan (Maria) of Sandy, Utah, Mark (Patricia) of Vineyard, Utah, and Kelly (Stasia) of South Weber, Utah. Her memory will also remain bright in the lives of her eight grandsons and eight granddaughters.
