



David Hyrum Thorne

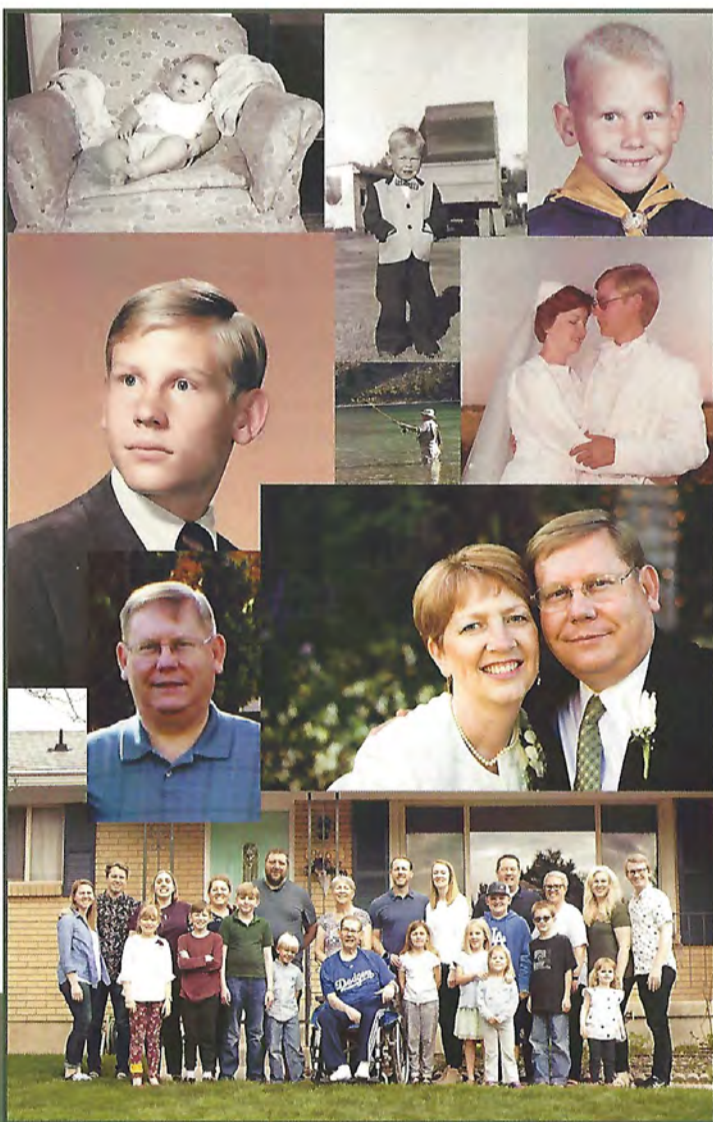
